

Angels (Luke 2:13-14) We cannot step into any of the incarnation narratives without running into the angels. The angel Gabriel first appears to Zechariah then a few months later to Mary. Twice an angel was sent to reassure Joseph, and a heavenly host hovered above a shepherd's field. Angels didn't just announce good news. They were also sent to protect the baby King from an illegitimate and ruthless king. An angel redirected the Magi's journey home and came to Joseph with instructions to escape to Egypt. Angels were created by and for Christ (Col 1:16). Spirits that do not die (Luke 20:36), they can don human form, and seem to have emotion, intellect, and will. They advocate, protect, make war, announce, teach, comfort and guide. But mostly, they worship the triune God.

The angels were witnesses to God's creation of the world, watching in wonder as the Trinity forms the universe with his spoken word. They watch this beautiful world turn dark as Eve believes Satan's lie. They know their God and they watch to see how his glory will be revealed. They watch in wonder as God unfolds history. So they announce to Zechariah, Mary and Joseph, flood the earth with celebration to the shepherds and warn the Magi. They rejoiced and sang because the incarnation reveals God's glory, His love, His holiness. Can we adore our God as we turn from war, poverty, racism, disease, violence knowing that all our days are being gathered by God as he gathers history to himself.

Foodbank Update

December was a very busy month for the Foodbank with 127 food packages being sent out. In total we helped feed 180 adults and 139 children. We received donations from several companies, organisations and churches. We are particularly thankful for the support of Father Andrew and the congregation of St Ignatius Church who throughout 2020 brought not only food but financial support. Every Thursday we receive a delivery from Fareshare of fresh and fro-

zen items including meat, fruit and vegetables. The administrative cost of this is being covered by Sunderland County Council (£100/month) and we have just been informed that this will continue for the rest of 2021.

Through this initiative we have been able to provide our clients with a more nutritious diet which will impact their overall health. Thank you to Chizenga who has joined the team allowing us to reopen on Tuesdays.

Reflection: The King and The Kingdom

We all look forward to the time when lock down ends and the restrictions are lifted but we need to consider how we as a church respond to the times in which we find ourselves. With that in mind, our Wednesday evening 'Reflection' has commenced a series called "THE KING AND THE KINGDOM", taking Matthew's Gospel as the basis for our study.

Matthew's gospel is written for and with the Jewish people in mind. He takes great effort to appeal to the thinking and mindset of the Jews. He commences in Chapter one of the gospel to show the babe, born in Bethlehem, is the longed for Saviour and Messiah. He who was promised by God, through the prophets, to be of great King David's family line is Jesus.

The Nation had been invaded and overrun numerous times since David and at this time were occupied by Rome. They had broken up the nation into areas ruled by Governor's and puppet Kings, of whom Herod was one. The people longed for the promised deliverer, Messiah and King to set them free and drive out the Romans. They looked for a king riding a white stallion and leading an army but Jesus came in the words of the prophet "behold thy King cometh to thee, meek and sitting upon an ass, the foal of a donkey" Matthew 21:11 & Zechariah 9:9.

Matthew throughout the gospel shows Jesus demonstrating and preaching about the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus teaches that the kingdom is not about land or country, but about the rule and reign of the King in the hearts and lives of His people. The song writer Ira Stanfield sums it up beautifully in these words;

He did not reign upon a throne of ivory
But died upon the cross of Calvary
For sinners there He counted all He owned but loss
And He surveyed His Kingdom from a cross

Chorus

A rugged cross became His throne
His kingdom was in hearts alone
He wrote His love in Crimson red
And wore the thorns upon His head

The study is not about **religion**, but **relationship**.

Week One: Knowing **who** the King Is and knowing Him **personally**.

Week Two: The ongoing battle between the Kingdom of **Light** and the Kingdom of **Darkness** and knowing **which Kingdom you're in**.

We have a battle to fight and a kingdom to bring in here and now not just in the sweet bye and bye!

Come and joins as we study The King and The Kingdom, you'll be blessed and challenged.

The Church Building

As you will know our church building is rather old and for many years there has been limited resources. A damp patch at the rear of the building has worsened and some skirting boards are beginning to rot. We consulted a damp specialist and various issues have been identified. Structural issues are re-



ferred to the management board at Elim Headquarters. We have submitted numerous reports, documents and quotes and it was an agenda item at last week's meeting. They are requiring further comments and will report back to us as soon as possible. The following are cost ranges connected to this. 1)Replacement of rear roof (above offices) £8,000 - 12,000. 2)Replacement of corroded wall ties and repointing of rear wall £2000—3200. 3) Drylining of chimney breast £2500

Additionally the heating system requires some attention regarding a longstanding issue that has never been fully resolved. We are in consultation with British Gas engineers and will provide further details at a later date. Estimated remedial cost currently is £3000.

The lights in the red carpeted room have not worked for many months due to water damage. Now that the section of the roof in that area has been repaired, we have engaged the services of an electrician. The kitchen lights have been replaced and work is ongoing in the red carpet room.

The Lord has entrusted his building to our stewardship, so please pray for wisdom for the Leadership Team, Management board etc.

Finance

Dec and Jan combined: Income £6992.45 Expenditure £3274.28.
Currently we are not paying a salary thus will be able to put any excess finance towards the building. Can we please ask that you prayerfully consider your giving? Some of our members have set up standing orders for which we are thankful. If you are a member or regular attendee and are not giving currently due to not being able to attend, could please get in touch so we can look at alternatives. We need to know what resources we have to cover the salary of a new minister. This is not a lack of faith, as we can testify to God's provision in 2020, but rather wise stewardship.

Please continue to pray that our Lord gives them His peace and protection.
